We turn the water off while brushing our teeth.



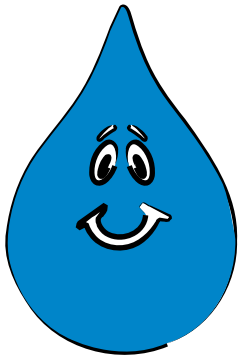
For our garden we choose plants that don't need a lot of water.

Now make up two water-saving activities of your own. Ask a classmate to tell whether water is being saved indoors or outdoors, or maybe even both places!



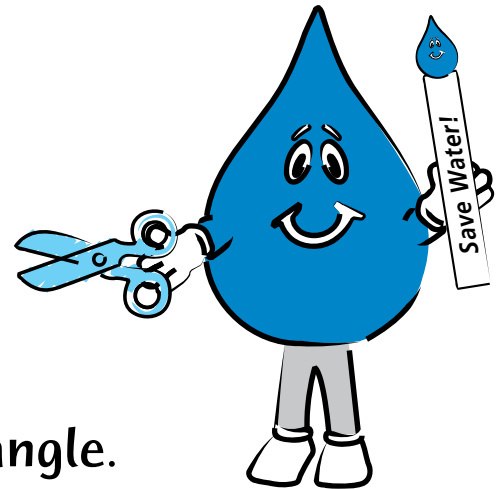
# Water Watcher Activity

## Materials:

1. Cut out a long rectangle.

3. Glue the water droplet onto the rectangle.
4. Write a message about saving or caring for water on the rectangle.
5. Color the bookmark.
