



A weather vane can tell us which way the wind is blowing.


A rain gauge can be used to tell how much it rained.


Which Tool Should You Use?


Is it hot or cold outside?

Questions:


- 1. How long did it take for the puddle to dry up?
- 2. Where did the water go that was in the puddle?




The letters below each picture are all mixed up. Write the correct word under each picture.
