2025 Public Supply Annual Report, Water Audit, and Water Conservation Workshop

The 2025 Public Supply Annual Reports are due by April 1, 2026. The District is holding free virtual workshops to aid in the completion of the Public Supply Annual Report. This report is an important source of information for the District's water supply planning, water use permitting, and water conservation programs.

During this year's workshop, we will host a live demonstration on collecting data required for the Public Supply Annual Report. Additionally, we will review applicable regulatory requirements and technical materials used to conduct Water Audits, with an emphasis on identifying sources of water loss within utility distribution systems. To conclude the workshop, we will discuss Water Conservation initiatives and the District's Water Loss Reduction Programs.

Who Should Attend:

Water utility staff/representatives responsible for completion of the Public Supply Annual Report will benefit most from attending one of these workshops. Additionally, utility staff interested in improved water accounting, conducting a Water Audit, or learning about water conservation opportunities would benefit from attending the workshop. There is no charge for the workshops.

- Review Public Supply Annual Report and District website
- Demonstrate how to complete Public Supply Annual Report using District tools
- Answer any questions about specific sections of the Public Supply Annual Report
- Discuss regulatory requirements and technical materials to complete Water Audits
- Cover Water Conservation initiatives and Water Loss Reduction Programs at the District.
