The Southwest Florida Water Management District (District) led a Facilitating Agricultural Resource Management Systems (FARMS) tour for the Agricultural and Green Industry Advisory Committee (AGIAC) members and District staff. The tour began at the Council Growers Sod Farm and ended at the UF/IFAS Gulf Coast Research and Education Center in Wimauma, Florida. On this half-day tour participants learned how the District's agricultural cost-share reimbursement program has helped growers improve water quality and natural systems while reducing groundwater withdrawals from the Upper Floridan aquifer through conservation and alternative water supply best management practices.
