1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Vice Chair John Mitten called the meeting to order. He led the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Vice Chair Mitten provided information to members of the public wishing to address the Governing Board concerning any item listed on the agenda or any item that does not appear on the agenda. He stated that comments would be limited to three minutes per speaker, and, when appropriate, exceptions to the three-minute limit may be granted by the chair. Vice Chair Mitten also requested that several individuals wishing to speak on the same issue/topic designate a spokesperson.

Vice Chair Mitten introduced each member of the Governing Board and staff present at the dais (this served as roll call). A quorum was confirmed.

2. **Opening Comments**

Vice Chair Mitten stated the first Truth in Millage (TRIM) public hearing is for the purpose of adopting a tentative millage rate and budget for the Southwest Florida Water Management District, pursuant to Sections 373.536 and 200.065, Florida Statutes. He stated this hearing also provided an opportunity for the public to speak and ask questions prior to the Governing Board's adoption of a tentative millage rate and budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2025.

Vice Chair Mitten stated the FY2025 tentative budget totals \$231.6 million compared to \$224.8 million for the FY2024 adopted budget; and continues a significant level of capital investment in our region to ensure the District's core mission is achieved. He stated these investments will continue to protect our water resources, spur the economy, and create jobs. Vice Chair Mitten stated the projects portion of the budget is \$135.1 million of the total budget for our District. Vice Chair Mitten indicated that \$76.5 million was for development of Alternative Water Supplies for existing and future reasonable and beneficial uses, \$10 million of which is from state appropriations.

Vice Chair Mitten provided a summary of the budget components that included projects, staffing, and other programs. He stated that the budget includes \$129.8 million in ad valorem property tax revenue based on the proposed millage rate equal to the rolled-back rate of 0.1909 which is lower than FY2024 millage rate of 0.2043. The rolled-back rate is the rate that would give the District the same amount of revenue as the current year plus taxes on any new construction.

Vice Chair Mitten thanked Governor DeSantis, the Department of Environmental Protection, and the legislature for state appropriations approved during this year's legislative session.

3. Budget Overview

Mr. Brandon Baldwin, Business and IT Services Director stated there were no changes to the FY2025 budget since the update at the July 23, 2024 Governing Board meeting.

4. <u>Public Announcement of the Name of the Taxing Authority, Rolled-Back Rate, Percentage of</u> <u>Increase Above Rolled-Back Rate, and Millage Rate to be Levied for Fiscal Year 2025</u>

Mr. Baldwin presented the required public announcement of the name of the taxing authority, the rolled-back rate, the percentage of increase above the rolled-back rate, and the millage rate to be levied for FY2025 and read into the record as required for the District. He stated, if adopted, this would be the thirteenth consecutive year the District has adopted a millage rate equal to or below the rolled-back rate for a cumulative reduction of 51 percent.
