2020 Public Supply Annual Report, Water Audit, and Conservation Workshop

The 2020 Public Supply Annual Reports are due by April 1, 2021. The District is holding free workshops to aid in the completion of the Public Supply Annual Report. This report is an important source of information for the District's water supply planning, water use permitting, and water conservation programs.

This year the District will also provide presentations on its Water Audit program and water conservation funding opportunities. This workshop will cover regulatory requirements for water audits as well as technical information on conducting water audits to identify sources of water loss in utility distribution systems. Participants will learn about tracking sources of water loss and how updates to utility operations can help aid in reducing water loss and recovering revenue water. There will be a separate presentation on the District's Cooperative Funding Initiative (CFI) process and WISE program, as well as past conservation projects.

Who Should Attend:

Water utility staff/representatives responsible for completion of the Public Supply Annual Report will benefit most from attending one of these workshops. Additionally, utility staff interested in improving water accounting and learning about water conservation funding opportunities would benefit from attending the workshop. There is no charge for the workshops.

Workshop Objectives:

- Review the Public Supply Annual Report and District website
- Demonstrate how to complete Public Supply Annual Report using District tools
- Answer any questions about specific sections of the Public Supply Annual Report
- Provide strategies to better track and identify sources of water loss
- Cover the CFI process, WISE program, and water conservation projects funded by the District
