




Introduction

The goal of this study was to gauge the public's perception of reused water. Two research issues raised in the study are:

- 1. Which terms for "reused" water are most acceptable to the public, and hence, will encourage more and varied uses of reused water
- 2. Which sources are most credible in speaking about reused water as being acceptable for more and varied uses

The data produced by this study can be utilized to educate the public and increase the acceptance of reused water.

Overall Recommendation

A comprehensive review of the results of this study reveals that the term "purified water" should be used in order to increase the acceptance of reused water for drinking and other uses. Purified water is the most understood term of the reused water terms and it has the most positive image, even higher than the term "drinking water." When using the term "purified water," it should be certified safe by a spokesperson from the National Academy of Sciences, Florida Department of Health, or the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. These institutions were the top three rated sources for the public in terms of credibility and willingness to accept reused water for a variety of uses, including drinking. Finally, when presenting purified (reused) water, the current practice scenario, where all the world's water is already being reused, is the most likely scenario to be accepted by the public for all uses. Positioning purified water in the context that all water is "used" could be implemented in conjunction with or in a tone similar to the Water Reuse Foundation's "Downstream" campaign.

Methodology

The population for this study included adults living in the following counties within the Southwest Florida Water Management District: 1. Hillsborough, 2. Pasco, 3. Pinellas, and 4. Polk. The sampling frame consisted of all working landline and cell telephone numbers in these four counties. A random sampling process was used to select households. To ensure a representative sample, interviews within contacted households were rotated across the following four classifications: 1. Youngest male over 21, 2. Oldest male over 21, 3. Youngest female over 21, and 4. Oldest female over 21.

Interviews were conducted June 12 through June 30, 2012 from Kerr & Downs Research's office. There were 384 completed interviews in each county resulting in a ±5 percentage points sampling error given a 95% confidence level. The total sample across four counties was 1,536, resulting in a 2.5 percentage points sampling error given a 95% confidence level. Ten percent of the completed interviews were validated by call-backs.

Major Findings

Water Attitudes

Six in ten residents (59%) agree that there will be enough water to meet their needs in ten years. In contrast, 37% of residents do not know the source of their tap water, 26% think it originates in the Floridan aquifer, and 13% believe it originates in lakes, rivers and streams.

Credibility of Information Sources

One research question examined in this study is the level of credibility possessed by various sources that offer information to the public about reused water. The following nine information sources were examined:

- **Environmental Protection Agency**
- Florida Department of Environmental Protection
- Florida Department of Health
- Internet sources
- Scientists from the National Academy of Sciences
- Southwest Florida Water Management District
- Traditional media (TV, radio, newspapers)
- University professors
- Water utility companies

Scientists from the National Academy of Sciences (NAS) have the highest credibility in speaking to the public about water quality. All sources, except the internet and traditional media, score rather well in terms of their credibility as sources of information about drinking water quality.

The Florida Department of Health was rated a close second to the scientists from NAS, and the EPA and Florida Department of Environmental Protection were a close third and fourth in terms of credibility.

Familiarity with Terms for Reused Water

While we have used the term reused water to this point, one objective of this study was to find the term or terms that best position reused water in the public's mind. Residents in the four counties in the study were asked about their familiarity with the following terms:

- Certified safe recycled water
- Drinking water
- Effluent water
- Grey water
- Highly processed water
- Highly purified water
- Highly treated waste water
- Highly treated water
- Potable water
- Purified recycled water
- Purified water
- Reclaimed water
- Recycled waste water
- Reused water
- Recycled water
- Sewage water
- Tap water
- Toilet to tap water
- Treated water
- Used water
- Waste water

For each term, residents were asked to indicate if they:

- Completely understand the term
- Have heard it, but do not quite understand it
- Have not heard the term

Drinking water and tap water are the two most understood terms, and more than seven in ten residents claim to completely understand them. Purified water is the reused water term understood by the highest percentage of residents (63%). A majority of residents also claim to completely understand the following terms:

- Waste water (54% completely understand the term)
- Treated water (53% completely understand the term)
- Sewage water (53% completely understand the term)
- Reclaimed water (52% completely understand the term)

Terms that have the lowest levels of awareness are:

- Effluent water (67% have not heard of)
- Grey water (61% have not heard of)
- Certified safe recycled water (52% have not heard of)
- Highly processed water (52% have not heard of)

Evaluative Component of Water Terms

Residents were asked to rate eighteen (18) water terms using a 10-point scale, where 10 conveys an extremely positive image and 1 conveys an extremely negative image. The top three terms are:

- Purified water
- Drinking water
- Highly purified water

It is significant that purified water is rated higher than drinking water. Tap water has a lower image than the terms listed above. Grey water, waste water, and recycled waste water had the lowest image scores.

One in three residents (32%) agrees that having someone they trust assure them that their water is safe is more important than being given all the facts. Six in ten residents (59%) are disgusted by the idea of drinking water after it has gone though a waste water treatment plant and then through a drinking water treatment plant.

Willingness to Drink Reused Water

Terms for reused water that scored highly in terms of image (acceptability) were then paired with sources of information that scored highly in terms of credibility when presenting information about water quality. Residents were asked whether or not they would be willing to drink reused water if it was certified safe and pure by each of the sources of information listed below. It should be noted that "drinking water," which scored highly in terms of image, was not used in this part of the study because the focus was on "reused" water terms when paired with various information sources.

The three reused water terms were:

- Purified recycled water
- Certified safe recycled water
- Highly purified water

Sources of information were:

- Florida Department of Health
- Florida Department of Environmental Protection
- Scientists at the National Academy of Sciences
- Florida universities
- Local water utility company

Residents were instructed to indicate whether they were willing, uncertain, or unwilling to drink reused water if it were certified by each of the information sources. With three terms for reused water and five sources of information, there were fifteen possible combinations of reused water terms and information sources.

The table below shows the percentages of residents who are willing to drink "reused" water when it is called "purified recycled water," "highly purified water," or "certified safe recycled water" and it is presented by one of the following sources:

- Florida Department of Environmental Protection
- Florida Department of Health
- Scientists at the National Academy of Sciences
- Local water utility company
- Florida universities

The percentage of residents who are willing to drink reused water ranged from a low of 46% (purified recycled water presented by a Florida university spokesperson) to a high of 71% (highly purified water presented by a Florida Department of Health spokesperson) as shown in the following table:

Willingness to Drink Reused Water

Residents were asked if they would be willing to use recycled water that had been certified safe and pure by either the Florida Department of Environmental Protection or scientists at the National Academy of Sciences for seven different uses, ranging from watering the lawn to drinking it. The results are summarized in the table below.

If certified safe and pure, residents are most willing to use recycled water for watering their lawn (88% to 89%, depending on the source of information). Fewer than half of residents (39% to 47%, depending on the source of information) are willing to drink recycled water. The differences in willingness to use recycled water based on whether the Florida Department of Environmental Protection or scientists at the National Academy of Sciences serve as the certifying agency are very slight, with one exception. In the case of drinking water, residents prefer scientists at the National Academy of Sciences to be the certifying agency.

Willingness to Use Recycled Water in Five Scenarios

Residents were presented with five scenarios for how recycled water could be treated and introduced into public consumption. In each of these scenarios, residents were asked if they would be willing to use recycled water for the following six uses:

- Water their lawns
- Water their vegetables
- Take a shower or bath
- Give to their pets to drink
- Cook pasta with it
- Drink

The five scenarios presented to residents in the study were as follows:

1. **Astronaut scenario**

Astronauts in space live in a closed loop system regarding water. They drink fresh water that is then recycled through their waste. This waste water is then purified and again consumed by the astronauts. If used water were purified for you in the same way it is purified for astronauts would you be willing to use it?

2. **Upstream discharge scenario**

Water comes from rivers, lakes, reservoirs and the aquifer. It is then treated for our drinking consumption, bathroom use, irrigation of farms, etc. This water travels through our sewer systems to a waste water treatment plant and is treated. Then it travels to a drinking water treatment plant where it is treated further. Then we use it again for drinking, bathroom use, irrigation of farms, etc. If used water were treated in this fashion, would you be willing to use it?

3. Blended reservoir scenario

Water that we have used for drinking, bathroom use, irrigation of farms, etc. is treated at a waste water treatment plant. Then it is further treated at a drinking water treatment plant. This water is put into our reservoirs, the aquifer and lakes to add to the water supply. Then water is taken from these reservoirs, the aquifer and lakes and treated at a drinking water treatment plant again. If used water were treated in this fashion, would you be willing to use it?

4. **Current practice scenario**

The air we breathe is recycled. It has been inside other people's lungs, inside animals, and around some of the grossest places on earth. Yet, we breathe in air without thinking about where it has been. Water we drink has been on and around the earth since day one. Someone else drank it or used it to go to the bathroom or it was in a cow trough at some point. Yet, it returns to our rivers, lakes, and aquifer. We treat it and then drink it again. If water were treated in this fashion, would you be willing to use it?

5. **Price discount**


Let's say that recycled water from your local water treatment plant has been certified as safe and pure by scientists at the National Academy of Sciences (or the Florida Department of Environmental Protection) and cost 20% less. That is to say that your water utility bill would go down 20%. Would you be willing to use it?


Presenting a brief story about how water is already recycled in current practice is the most effective way of positioning recycled water. Significantly more residents (55%) claim they will drink recycled water if it were treated as it is in current practice. The current practice scenario also results in the highest use percentages for all other uses except for taking a shower or bath, in which case the blended reservoir scenario has the highest rate of acceptance. Significantly, the current practice is more effective in getting residents to accept recycled water than a 20% price discount.

"Real-life" depiction of astronaut scenario1





Depiction of upstream discharge scenario¹





Advantages & Disadvantages of Recycled Water

The three terms for recycled water that were most acceptable to residents were used to examine the advantages and disadvantages of recycled water. These three terms were:

- Purified recycled water
- Certified safe recycled water
- Highly purified water

A plurality of residents (26%) believes that using recycled water presents no advantages to them. Nearly one in five residents (18%) states that ensuring a continuing supply of water and saving the environment are two advantages of using recycled water. Just over one in ten residents thinks saving money (12%) and having safer/healthier water (11%) are advantages of using recycled water.

A plurality of residents (37%) also believes there are no disadvantages to using recycled water. Two in ten residents (19%) think using recycled water would "expose them to something bad." One in six residents (16%) is more specific about what "bad" means and expresses concerns about getting sick or being exposed to bacteria. Only 6% of residents mention bad taste and only 4% listed odor as potential problems of using recycled water.

Current Water Sources & Attitudes

Six in ten residents in the study (62%) drink tap water; nearly as many residents (61%) have a filter on their tap or a filtration system in their homes. Over eight out of ten residents (84%) drink bottled water; of those who drink tap and bottled water, more consume water that comes from the tap.

Only 9% of residents believe that drinking water already contains reclaimed water. Just over two out of ten residents (22%) say they water their lawns with reclaimed water. About one in four residents (23%) agrees that highly treated reclaimed water is as pure as water from the aquifer.


Eighty-five percent (85%) of residents get their water from a utility company and 20% get it from a well (some get it from both sources). Over half of residents (53%) who have wells use them for purposes other than watering their lawns.

Demographics

The typical participant in this study:

- Lived in the area 16 years
- Lives in the area year-round
- Is 48 years old
- Is white (69%)
- Has completed some college
- Has a household income of \$52,000

Equal percentages of males and females participated in the study, and participants are equally dispersed between the four counties represented in the study (Pasco, Pinellas, Hillsborough, and Polk).





Water Attitudes


Six in ten residents (59%) agree that there will be enough water to meet their needs in ten years. This belief is greatest among residents in Polk County (65%) and lowest in Hillsborough County (57%).


Two in five residents (37%) do not know the sources of their tap water. Confusion regarding the sources of tap water is highest in Pinellas County (41%) and lowest in Hillsborough County (29%). One in four residents (26%) thinks their tap water comes from the Floridan aquifer system and 13% believe it originates in lakes, rivers, and streams. The belief that residents' tap water originates in the Floridan aquifer system is greatest in Pinellas County (28%).
















Based on what you know or have heard, what are the main sources of your tap water?

















Credibility of Information Sources

Scientists from the National Academy of Sciences (NAS) have the highest credibility as a source for information about water quality with a score of 7.3 on a ten-point scale. Trust in scientists from the NAS was highest among residents in Pinellas (7.5) and Polk counties (7.5), and lowest in Pasco County (6.9). The Florida Department of Health (7.2), the Environmental Protection Agency (7.1), and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (7.0) rate second, third, and fourth, in terms of credibility. The Environmental Protection Agency is the most credible source in Hillsborough County (7.4 rating) and the Florida Department of Health is tied with scientists from the NAS (7.5 rating) as the most credible source in Polk County.

Average ratings for sources of information on drinking water quality*/**








If Southwest Florida Water Management District reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?*









If your water utility company reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?







If university professors reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?







If television, radio or newspaper news sources reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?







If internet sources reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?







If scientists from the National Academy of Sciences reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?







If the Environmental Protection Agency reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?







If the Florida Department of Environmental Protection reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?






If the Florida Department of Health reported to you on the quality of drinking water, how much would you trust the information?










Familiarity with Terms for Reused Water

Drinking water and tap water are the two most understood terms and over seven in ten residents (72% and 71%, respectively) claim to completely understand both of them. Drinking water is the most understood term among residents of all counties interviewed in this study, and tap water was second in all counties, except for Pasco County where it was third.


Purified water is the reused water term that is understood by the highest percentage of residents (63%). Understanding of this term is greatest among residents in Pasco County (72%) and lowest in Hillsborough County (58%). At least half of residents claim they completely understand the following terms: waste water, reclaimed water, treated water, and sewage water. At least half of residents in the following counties (relevant county in parentheses) claim to completely understand the terms recycled water (Pasco) and recycled waste water (Hillsborough).

The terms that have the lowest levels of understanding are effluent water (67% had never heard of) and grey water (61%). Understanding of the term effluent water is lowest in Hillsborough County (70% have not heard of) and understanding of the term grey water is lowest in Pasco County (64%).


What do you know about waste water?*




What do you know about highly treated water?*




What do you know about effluent water?*




What do you know about potable water?*




What do you know about reclaimed water?*




What do you know about recycled water?*




What do you know about purified water?*






What do you know about certified safe recycled water?*












What do you know about recycled waste water?*




Evaluative Component of Water Terms

When asked to rate water terms using a 10-point scale, where 10 conveys an extremely positive image and 1 conveys an extremely negative image, the following terms have an average rating of at least 7 or higher: purified water (7.5), drinking water (7.2), and highly purified water (7.2). Tap water was fourth with a rating of 6.4. Ratings of purified water are consistent across counties, with average ratings landing within one-tenth of a point to the overall average. Drinking water is rated highest among residents in Pinellas (7.5) and Polk counties (7.5) and lowest in Pasco County (6.9). Terms with the lowest image scores are grey water (3.0) and waste water (3.3).

One in three residents (32%) agrees that having someone they trust assure them that their water is safe is more important than being given all of the facts. This belief is strongest among residents in Polk County (36%) and lowest in Hillsborough County (27%).

Six in ten residents (59%) are disgusted by the idea of drinking water after it has gone through a waste water treatment plant and then through a drinking water treatment plant. This belief is highest among residents in Pasco County (65%) and lowest in Hillsborough County (53%).

Willingness to Drink Reused Water

Terms for reused water that scored highly in terms of image (acceptability) were paired with sources of information that scored highly in terms of credibility when presenting information about water quality. Residents were asked whether or not they would be willing to drink reused water if it was certified safe and pure by each of the sources of information listed below.

The three reused water terms were:

- Purified recycled water
- Certified safe recycled water
- Highly purified water

Sources of information were:

- Florida Department of Health
- Florida Department of Environmental Protection
- Scientists at the National Academy of Sciences
- Florida universities
- Local water utility company

The percentage of residents who are willing to drink reused water ranges from a low of 46% (purified recycled water presented by a Florida university spokesperson) to a high of 71% (highly purified water presented by a Florida Department of Health spokesperson). Overall, highly purified water scores higher than certified safe recycled water and purified recycled water. Additionally, the Florida Department of Health, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, and scientists at the National Academy of sciences rate higher than the local water utility company and Florida universities as sources of information.

The highest rated combinations of reused water terms and information sources by county are as follows:

- Hillsborough County: purified recycled water presented by a Florida Department of Health spokesperson (68% of residents willing to drink this type of reused water)
- Pasco County: purified recycled water presented by a Florida Department of Environmental Protection spokesperson (68% of residents willing to drink this type of reused water)
- Pinellas County: highly purified water presented by a Florida Department of Health or Florida Department of Environmental Protection spokesperson (69% of residents willing to drink this type of reused water)
- Polk County: highly purified water presented by a Florida Department of Health spokesperson (85% of residents willing to drink this type of reused water)

Willingness to Use Recycled Water for Seven Uses

Residents were asked if they would use recycled water, that had been certified safe and pure by either the Florida Department of Environmental Protection or scientists at the National Academy of Sciences for seven different uses, ranging from watering the lawn to drinking it.

If certified safe and pure, residents are most willing to use recycled water for watering their lawn (88% to 89% depending on the source of information). Willingness to use recycled water for watering lawns is highest among residents in Polk County (90% to 93%, depending on the source of information).

Fewer than half of residents (39% to 47%, depending on the source of information) are willing to drink recycled water. Willingness to use recycled water for drinking is highest among residents in Polk County (52% to 53%, depending on the source of information).

Willingness to Use Recycled Water in Five Scenarios

Residents were presented with five different scenarios for how recycled water could be treated and introduced into public consumption. In each of these scenarios, residents were asked if they would be willing to use recycled water for the following six uses:

- Water their lawns
- Water their vegetables
- Take a shower or bath
- Give to their pets to drink
- Cook pasta with it
- Drink

The five scenarios presented to residents in the study were as follows:

1. **Astronaut scenario**

Astronauts in space live in a closed loop system regarding water. They drink fresh water that is then recycled through their waste. This waste water is then purified and again consumed by the astronauts. If used water were purified for you in the same way it is purified for astronauts would you be willing to use it?

2. Upstream discharge scenario

Water comes from rivers, lakes, reservoirs and the aquifer. It is then treated for our drinking consumption, bathroom use, irrigation of farms, etc. This water travels through our sewer systems to a waste water treatment plant and is treated. Then it travels to a drinking water treatment plant where it is treated further. Then we use it again for drinking, bathroom use, irrigation of farms, etc. If used water were treated in this fashion, would you be willing to use it?

3. Blended reservoir scenario

Water that we have used for drinking, bathroom use, irrigation of farms, etc. is treated at a waste water treatment plant. Then it is further treated at a drinking water treatment plant. This water is put into our reservoirs, the aquifer and lakes to add to the water supply. Then water is taken from these reservoirs, the aquifer and lakes and treated at a drinking water treatment plant again. If used water were treated in this fashion, would you be willing to use it?

Current practice scenario 4.

The air we breathe is recycled. It has been inside other people's lungs, inside animals, and around some of the grossest places on earth. Yet, we breathe in air without thinking about where it has been. Water we drink has been on and around the earth since day one. Someone else drank it or used it to go to the bathroom or it was in a cow trough at some point. Yet, it returns to our rivers, lakes, and aquifer. We treat it and then drink it again. If water were treated in this fashion, would you be willing to use it?

5. **Price discount**


Let's say that recycled water from your local water treatment plant has been certified as safe and pure by scientists at the National Academy of Sciences (or the Florida Department of Environmental Protection) and cost 20% less. That is to say that your water utility bill would go down 20%. Would you be willing to use it?

Presenting a brief story about how water is already recycled in current practice is the most effective way of positioning recycled water. Significantly more residents (55%) claim they will drink recycled water if it is treated in this fashion. Preference for positioning reused water in this fashion is highest among residents in Polk County (72%) and lowest in Pasco County (45%).

Willingness to Use Recycled Water in Five Scenarios


The current practice scenario produced the highest use percentages for all other uses except taking a shower or bath, in which case the blended reservoir scenario has the highest rate of acceptance. Willingness to use recycled water given the current practice scenario is highest in Hillsborough and Pasco counties, and lowest in Pinellas County.

"Real-life" depiction of astronaut scenario1





Depiction of upstream discharge scenario¹





Advantages & Disadvantages of Recycled Water

The three terms for recycled water that were most acceptable to residents were used to examine the advantages and disadvantages of recycled water. These three terms were:

- Purified recycled water
- Certified safe recycled water
- Highly purified water

A plurality of residents (26%) believes that using recycled water presents no advantages to them. This belief is highest in Pasco (27%), Pinellas (27%), and Polk counties (27%) and lowest in Hillsborough County (20%).

Nearly one in five residents (18%) states that ensuring a continuing supply of water and saving the environment are two advantages of using recycled water. The belief that ensuring a continuing water supply is an advantage of recycled water is stable across counties. The belief that saving the environment is an advantage of recycled water is highest among residents in Hillsborough County (20%) and lowest in Pasco County (14%).


Just over one in ten residents thinks saving money (12%) and having safer/healthier water (11%) are advantages of using recycled water. The belief that saving money is an advantage of recycled water is stable across counties. The belief that having safer/healthier water is an advantage of recycled water is highest in Polk County (14%) and lowest in Pinellas County (8%).


A plurality of residents (36%) believes there are no disadvantages to using recycled water. This belief is highest among residents in Polk County (41%) and lowest in Hillsborough County (30%).


Two in ten residents (19%) think using recycled water would "expose them to something bad." This belief is highest among residents in Polk County (22%) and lowest in Pasco County (17%). One in six residents (16%) is more specific about what "bad" means and expresses concerns about getting sick or being exposed to bacteria. This belief is highest among residents in Hillsborough County (19%) and lowest in Polk County (11%).

Only 6% of residents mention bad taste and only 4% list odor as potential problems of using recycled water. The belief that bad taste and odor are potential problems of using recycled water is highest among residents in Pinellas County (8%).

Current Water Sources & Attitudes

Six in ten residents in the study (62%) drink tap water. Incidence of drinking tap water is highest among residents in Pasco and Pinellas counties (65%), and lowest in Hillsborough County (56%).

Six in ten residents in the study (61%) have a filter on their tap or a filtration system in their home. This practice is highest among residents in Pasco County (70%) and lowest in Pinellas County (54%).

Over eight out of ten residents (84%) drink bottled water; of those who drink tap and bottled water, more consume water that comes from the tap. The percentage of residents who drink bottled water is highest among residents in Hillsborough County (88%) and lowest in Pinellas County (81%). More than half of Polk County residents (54%) who drink tap and bottled water consume more tap water.

One in ten residents (9%) believes that their drinking water already contains reclaimed water. This belief is highest among residents in Hillsborough County (12%) and lowest in Pinellas County (6%).


About one in four residents (23%) agrees that highly treated reclaimed water is as pure as water from the aquifer. This belief is highest among residents in Polk County (34%) and lowest in Pasco County (16%).


